The National Security Building, now named the Orville A. Turnquest Building, is the home of the Ministry of National Security, including the Royal Bahamas Police Force and the Royal Bahamas Defense Force.

The occasion is marked by NIB's continued mandate to prudently invest the National Insurance Fund for
