## 2012 Amendments to the National Insurance Regulations

Changes to Benefit & Assistance Regulations	Rationale & Effect
14(3); 14(4)(b); and 14(6)	<ul> <li>Reduced the length of time claimants allowed to submit claims – from 12 months to 6 months for Funeral and from 6 months to 3 months for all other benefits.</li> </ul>
18 to 21	Allows the payment of Retirement Benefit to persons 65 and over who remain employed with wages in excess of 50% of the wage ceiling. Currently, the age is 70.
	• Allows for an increase of 7/12% per month if Retirement benefit is awarded after 65 similar to the reduction applied if awarded under age 65.
21A	Ensures that people who qualify for a Retirement Grant cannot use these same contributions to qualify later for Retirement Benefit (pension) if they make additional contributions.
24 and 25	Provides for someone who dies after age 65 who had more than 150 contributions but less than 500 (would have qualified for a Retirement grant only) to enable spouse to get a Survivors Benefit.
25, 29A, 60	For Survivors Benefit, removed the requirement that couple must have been married for at least one year.
28(2)	Allows orphans (only) to receive Survivors Benefit if they are in part-time education. (Previously, if was not in fulltime education, the benefit was suspended)
31	Allows for the payment of Sickness Benefit even if illness due to alcohol or drugs. (Sickness assistance and Invalidity benefit can be awarded in such cases.)
47(D)4	Vacation pay will delay the start of unemployment benefit.

Changes, Cont'd	Rationale & Effect
Revise 63(2)	<ul> <li>Increased from \$5,000 to \$10,000 the maximum amount payable to a dependant of someone who dies while in the course of employment and has no eligible spouse, children or parents.</li> </ul>
Revise 89(4)	Provides for the award of OANCP if the person previously qualified for a Retirement Grant.
Revise 108(4)	Employers to submit accident report within 1 month instead of 3 months

Changes to Contributions Regulations	Rationale & Effect
Revise 2 (definition of basic wages)	<ul> <li>Changed "basic wage" to include productivity determined wages that form part of one's basic pay. For example, drivers of gas trucks are paid \$100 flat plus \$5 for every tank they fill. The full wage should be insurable not just the \$100.</li> </ul>
