The National Prescription Drug Plan is one of several initiatives by the Government of The Bahamas, administered by the National Insurance Board, to improve access to health care and services. It is the first step towards a national and comprehensive health and wellness program. Since its successful implementation 10 years ago, it has greatly enhanced the health and quality of life for thousands of Bahamians.

Here is how:







Providing ACCESS for 5 categories at 100%

- 1. NIB Pensioners receiving Retirement Benefit or Grant, Old-Age Non Contributory Pension, Survivors Benefit/Assistance (age 60 & over) and Disablement Benefit
- 2. NIB Invalids receiving Invalidity Benefit and Assistance.
- 3. Bahamian citizens age 65 and over.
- 4. Children under 18 years or under 25 years (Full-time students).
- 5. Indigent persons, Government employees and Women receiving ante-natal and post-natal care

Improving health

For persons suffering from one or more of 15 chronic diseases: Rheumatic Disease, Asthma, Benign Prostate Hypertrophy, Breast Cancer, Chronic Heart Disease, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), Diabetes, Epilepsy, Glaucoma, High Cholesterol, Hypertension, Prostate Cancer, Psychiatric Illness, Sickle Cell Anemia and Thyroid Disease.

Reduce costs for healthcare

Currently Drug Plan members incur no costs as the Plan is funded entirely from the Medical Benefits Branch of The National Insurance Board.
